




MUSEUM MAP



The Jaffee History Trail is an interpretive path incorporating features such as a native species garden, the Couch Tomb, and a 13,000-pound, metal relic from the 1871 Great Chicago Fire.

Yes, the North & Clark Café and the Museum Store are on the 1st floor near the entrance of the Museum. The Café closes approximately 1 hour prior to the Museum closing. The Museum Store is open during Museum hours.

FACING FREEDOM IN AMERICA




THE GREAT CHICAGO ADVENTURE
